IICRC Odor Control Technician

Comprehensive deodorization and decontamination—a must for every restoration technician! We'll begin the course with general concepts, such as how odor is perceived, odor types, the difference between "real" and "psychological" odor, how odor is amplified, and how it penetrates surfaces. It covers the types and underlying principles of odor contamination, sources, containment and six options for removing odor and contamination. It also covers particles as irritants, toxic gases, smoke odor, cleaning contaminated surfaces and recreating the conditions of odor permeation with appropriate counteractants. Additionally, the course covers PPE, chemical agent application and safety concerns, equipment, terminology and demonstrations of deodorization and decontamination equipment, sprayers, wet foggers, dry foggers, and ozone generators. Loss management is covered by highlighting common deodorization and decontamination losses. We'll also cover step-by-step procedures for dealing with animal urine, freezer power failure, decomposed animals, skunk odor, a summary of rules for bloodborne pathogens, smoke odor, contents and automotive odor issues.
